1st Call for Proposals under IPA III Programme Montenegro - Kosovo published!

The 1st Call for project proposals under the IPA III CBC Programme Montenegro-Kosovo 2021-2027 was published on 10th September 2024. The deadline for submitting concept notes is 25 October 2024.

The Call is open to local governments represented in the programme area, local and regional development organisations/agencies, national authorities and institutions overseeing environmental, cultural tourism, policies, associations, business business support self-employment organisations, promotion institutions, chambers of commerce and crafts, organisations society (CSOs), cooperatives/associations of farmers, development organisations/agencies, educational, science and research institutions and organisations and institutions responsible for providing social services.

As part of this call, projects worth up to 400,000 euros that aim to increase cross-border employment of youth and vulnerable people will be supported, as well as projects worth up to 600,000 euros that aim at boosting sustainable tourism in the cross-border region. The duration of projects is limited to 26 months for projects in the field of employment, and for projects

in the field of tourism 30 months, while the total budget of this call is 5.4 million euros.

The programme area in Montenegro includes the municipalities: Andrijevica, Bar, Berane, Bijelo Polje, Gusinje, Kolašin, Mojkovac, Petnjica, Plav, Podgorica, Rožaje, Tuzi, Ulcinj and Zeta. In Kosovo the programme area includes: Pejë/Peć, Istog/Istok, Klinë/Klina, Junik/Junik, Deçan/Dečani and Gjakovë/Đakovica.

News on projects financed under the 3rd CfP IPA CBC Programme Montenegro - Albania

Support to potential entrepreneurs in the area of Fushë-Arrëz and Malësia e Madhe

In August 2024, a call for expressions of interest was published to support potential entrepreneurs in the areas of Fushë-Arrëz and Malësia e Madhe. The call involves a two-step sleection process: first, 10 candidates will be pre-selected, and then a final selection of a maximum of 5 candidates will be made. The finalists will each be awarded up to EUR 5,000 to invest in their new businesses.

Preference will be given to start-up businesses that include vulnerable groups, activities that involving vulnerable groups, business initiatives that promote cross-border labour mobility, as well as the creation of new products and services, development of marketing plan, networking strategy, creation of operational structures and activities for building

capacities for vulnerable groups (women, young people, long-term unemployed persons, persons with disabilities). The proposed ideas



should

developed in the Fushë Arrëz and/or Malësia e Madhe municipalities, ideally belonging to one or more of the following intervention sectors: Environment Protection, Waste Management, Agriculture and Rural Development (Green Economy), Tourism, Technology and Innovation.



In July 2024, the Institute for Sustainable Policies in cooperation with Fushë Arrëz municipality organized five theoretical training sessions for selected 35 long-term unemployed applicants from rural and suburban areas of Fushë Arrëz and Malësia e Madhe. The capacity building activities incorporated various topics such as job search methods, rules for appearing in a job interview, competencies for employment, building personal brand in social media, networking, effective workplace communication, conflict resolution strategies, relationship building and teamwork skills, using of online platforms, professional development opportunities, etc.

Cleaning actions performed in Gusinje

As part of the project Joint Environmental Protection Action (JEPA), implemented by the municipalities of Gusinje and Puka, a series of cleaning activities took place in Gusinje in July 2024. With support from volunteers, the lead partner organized the cleanup of the Grnčar river bank, a school training ground, Ali Pasha's springs and the Vuthaj area. The aim of this effort was to help preserve the environment in Gusinje.



Moreover, in order to protect the environment and improve communication between the local self-government and citizens, the project partners developed an app named <u>Green Alert Gusinje</u> and <u>Green Alert Puke</u>, through which it is possible to report a problem in the field of environmental protection in a simple way and thus contribute to a healthier environment.





Best business ideas selected and supported

The activities related to empowerment of the participants to start their own business continued within the project *Skills for Jobs Albania – Montenegro* implemented by Foundation Business Start-Up Centre Bar, Chamber of Economy of Montenegro and Albanian Investment Development Agency.



The set of activities that envisaged capacity building sessions, mentoring and financial support were completed in Montenegro and in Albania in July 2024. During the workshops participants were educated on possible ways of financing business ideas, as well as on how to present a business idea to the potential financial supporters, while in parallel, they were supported by mentors in developing their business plans.



After completing the workshops and receiving mentoring support for starting a business, participants from both countries prepared and submitted their business plans. They then presented their business ideas to a committee. Prizes of EUR 3,000 were awarded to the 8 best business plans from Montenegro and the 5 best business plans from Albania.

New equipment for monitoring of forests in Bar and Shkodra

Better monitoring of forests, biodiversity and ecosystem health is made possible by remote sensing technologies, satellite imagery and Geographic Information Systems (GIS) that are being used in the Municipality of Shkodër and Municipality of Bar, contributing significantly to the improvement of forest conservation and management.

The Fire Detection System was supplied in Shkodra and Bar during July 2024, while the project will further enable the construction of a monitoring station equipped with advanced data processing and visualization tools in Volujica in Bar and on the hill of Bardhaj village in Rrethina Administrative Unit.

The project *Building Smart Forests* is aimed at early detection, minimisation of fire, protecting human lives and improved efficiency in fire management, and is being implemented by the Foundation for Local Autonomy and Governance (FLAG) from Albania, in partnership with Bar and Shkodra municipalities.















National workshops held

Two national workshops were organized within the project Skadar/Shkoder Lake Watershed – a Transboundary Biosphere Reserve that is being implemented by EDEN center, National Agency of Protected Areas in Albania and EnvPro and National Parks in Montenegro.



As continuation, the Second National Workshop was held in the period of 12 - 14 June 2024 focusing on situation analysis, conceptual



efforts of preparing the Skadar/Shkodra Lake Watershed for its nomination as transboundary biosphere reserve. Moreover, the Third National Workshop on the establishment of the Transboundary Biosphere Reserve of the Skadar/Shkodra Lake Watershed was held in Montenegro focusing on understanding UNESCO MAB reserve functions and identifying priority throats, tackling common challenges, and

and identifying priority threats, tackling common challenges and aligning strategies for future biosphere reserve mandate, as well as on developing communication and educational strategies for the future reserve.

News on projects financed under the 3rd CfP IPA CBC Programme Montenegro - Kosovo

"ACT SMART - SAVE WATER"

The project *Culture heritage – Act SMART, save water!* implemented by Kosovo Development Centre – KDC in cooperation with LLC Water Supply Company "Vodovod Bistrica" from Bijelo Polje and Regional Water Company "Hidrodrini" – JSC Peja, continued with its activities aiming at improvement of water management in the municipalities of Peja and Bjelo Polje.

The project partners are finalizing the activities that envisage procurement, dissemination and installation of the Smart water meter system in the selected area in the cross-border municipalities. The aim of this activity is to reduce water losses by replacement and installation of water meters for remote reading. The equipment has been already delivered to the RWC "HIDRODRINI" – Peja and will be soon delivered to "Vodovod Bistrica" in Bijelo Polje.

Tuzi and Peja together for cleaner and greener cities

The municipality of Tuzi and municipality of Peja continue with the implementation of the project *New Environment Revitalization Approach – NERA*.

The Public Hearing of Local Environment Action Plan was organized in Peja and citizens from diverse backgrounds came together to share their insights and suggestions before the final approval of the document. Accordingly, after the public consultations, the Local Assembly of Peja Municipality officially approved the Local Environment Action Plan on 29 May 2024. This plan marks a significant step towards a greener and more sustainable future for both communities.



Additionally, within the project the apps <u>Nera - T</u> and <u>Nera - P</u> have been designed and launched to enhance the efficiency of municipal services in waste management and foster better communication with citizens to improve the environment.





In order to raise awareness on waste management, the project partners organized two educational sessions with agriculture producers from Tuzi and Peja, focusing on the key principles of composting and methods for quality efficiency, as well as best practices in Europe undertaken by the most successful companies in applying the "Zero Waste" concept. Moreover, 20 educational sessions were held with over 700 high school pupils in Peja and Tuzi, mainly focused on waste reduction, reuse, recycling and composting as key elements of proper waste management and impact on the environment.



The Municipality of Peja has procured Street Vacuum Cleaners, high-tech machines that will enable easier and more effective way for street maintenance, as well as maintenance tools such as self-moving grass cutters and hedge trimmers, ensuring that green areas remain effortlessly maintained.



In addition, to improve efficient waste management and recycling in community, the Municipality of Tuzi placed underground waste sorting containers across the municipality, as well as large-capacity plastic bins in 10 key locations for four types of waste: plastic, paper, metal and organic waste. On the other side, Peja Municipality placed cans for disposal of small trash along the river in Peja.



Also, the employees of "Komunalno – Komunale" LLC in Tuzi finalized the capacity building activities on provision of service to the citizens based on "Zero Waste" concept and initiated the activity of delivering waste separation bags for 480 households.

Preparing youth for employment

The project partners Institute for Strategic Studies and Prognoses (ISSP), Institute for Development Policy (INDEP), Chamber of Economy of Montenegro and Municipality of Mojkovac within the project Young NEETs: new opportunities for work and increased employability — "UNEETED" initiated with activities that aim to improve the social position of young NEETs in 8 municipalities in Montenegro and Kosovo.

Training for young NEETs in Bijelo Polje was held in period 12-14 June 2024, which brought together 20 young people from Bijelo Polje and Kosovo. During the training, participants had the opportunity to express their problems and challenges in integrating into society, job searching, and accessing education and professional development. Discussions focused on various aspects of the labour market, current trends, and ways for young people to better prepare for employment.



Also, INDEP organized a joint seminar with 20 young people NEETs from Kosovo and Montenegro, in Peja in period of 5-7 July 2024. Over three days, participants engaged in lectures covering employment opportunities, essential skills and current industry trends. This workshop provided a valuable platform for these young individuals to increase their employability, get to know the issues better, socialize and prepare for future career opportunities.

Project partners also finalized and published the researches aiming to identify the challenges faced by NEET youth and to explore new opportunities for improving their employability and integrating them into the workforce in <u>Montenegro</u> and <u>Kosovo</u>.

Capacity building activities for youth in Kosovo and Montenegro

Within the project *No Borders!* implemented by Chamber of Economy of Montenegro, Chamber of Commerce of the Republic of Kosovo, Regional Business Centre Berane and Education, Training and Research Institute (ETRI), the Call for Expression of Interest for attending certified trainings on touristic guides in Kosovo was open during July 2024.

Since May 2024, the partners in Kosovo have organized training for 15 young people from the municipalities of Peja, Istog, Klina, Junik, Deçan and Gjakova. The young people in the next period will continue with mentoring by the team of experts engaged in the project. After the training, the certified youth will have the opportunity to apply for financial grants to start with the implementation of business ideas.



In Montenegro, the three-month training for the development of business ideas was successfully completed, during which the participants had the opportunity to acquire the necessary skills and knowledge to improve their business ideas. The training included problem definition, target group analysis, generation and development of business ideas, as well as idea testing and prototyping, the importance of strategic planning for business development, analysis of the environment and needs (SWOT, PESTEL analysis), and the importance of setting business goals and choosing strategies for achieving goals. The participants got acquainted with different models of company registration, legal-administrative conditions, permits and licenses needed to start a business. The practical part of the training included making a checklist of documents needed for business registration.



Moreover, through training on digital and content marketing, participants were introduced to the key elements of digital marketing such as websites, social networks, e-mail, SEO and PPC. Through practical exercises, they had the opportunity to create profiles on social networks and develop content strategies, focusing on the integration of different digital marketing channels.

Equipment and vehicles for utility companies in Montenegro and Kosovo

Through the project *Cross-border Green Deal*, project partners FORS Montenegro, ECMI Kosovo and the Municipality of Berane continue with activities aiming at improving environmental protection in the cross-

border region between Montenegro and Kosovo. In Montenegro, the procurement of vehicles for utility companies and inspections has been completed and 2 vehicles as well as a waste collection truck were delivered to respective institutions, while the equipment for utility companies and inspections in Kosovo will be procured in the upcoming period.



The second cross-border training on improving the solid waste management system was organized in Peja in May 2024 for representatives of institutions responsible for environmental protection, communal and inspection services and communal companies in order to strengthen their capacities and develop cross-border cooperation in this area. Several ECO Events and activities were conducted by project partners on both sides of the border. Namely, partners marked Earth Day and World Environment Day, while the ECO Caravans with promotional activities initiated in Klina on 5 June 2024.



Moreover, 26 ECO Workshops were organized for over 500 primary and secondary school students, as well as 5 ECO workshops for over 150 members of local population. An awareness raising campaign on reduction of the use of plastic bags is on-going through direct contact with citizens and in cooperation with local business. The Research on the structure of waste in some of the target municipalities and possibilities for the improvement of waste management system is on-going in Montenegro and in Kosovo.

Touristic acquisition of Tumbarice Castrum and Turkish Bath in Peja in progress

The lead partner Museum of Polimlje from Berane and NGO "Marimangat e Pejës" from Kosovo have continued with conservation works at the Tumbarice archaeological site and on Turkish Bath in Peja within the project Evocation and Attraction of Cultural Heritage – Christian Antiquity and Turkish Bath for Cultural Tourism.



As part of project activities, the Archaeological Youth event was organized in Berane in period 5th-6th June 2024, with the aim to inform and increase knowledge of students on the methods and techniques which are used during excavation and conservation works, as well as on 3D scanning and photogrammetry as the contemporary methods for digital preservation and monitoring of cultural sites and monuments.



The event included archaeological classes and workshops with students, while also students from Berane and Peja had an amazing time exploring the historic Tumbarice Castle. Additionally, project partners created the

digital platform for 3d models with information on the Christian Antiquity and Turkish Bath that create cultural and touristic attractive material and easily accessible information to tourists, visitors and researchers. Please check the video of digital platform model here.

C.L.O.S.E.R.

In Kosovo, a new and innovative activity arises from workshops on developing the Management Plan for the Creative Hub West. This initiative is set to test the regional impact of project activities in the western part of Kosovo. Namely, the workshop brought together students from six municipalities in the Western Economic Region for an unforgettable experience at the cultural heritage site "Ura e Fshejt". This exciting pilot activity aimed to foster regional cooperation and cultural appreciation for adventure among our youth. By integrating cultural heritage with outdoor activities, the project partners aimed to create a memorable experience that highlights the unique blend of history and nature in targeted region.



Moreover, the project partners announced the successful completion of two pivotal activities in Municipality of Bar. In particular, two enriching workshops focusing on "Interpretation content of the revitalized cultural routes of the Old Town Bar" were organized and gathered experts and enthusiasts from both sides of the border to delve into the history, culture, and future of this iconic heritage site. Also, cutting-edge cross-border training course was organized aimed at empowering local youth with essential STEM skills. Focusing on 3D modelling and programming, this initiative is set to revolutionize tourism management by fostering innovation and technical prowess among the talented young participants.



The Kosovo Foundation for Cultural Heritage Without Borders and Municipality of Bar are implementing the project C.L.O.S.E.R. – Culture-Led Opportunities for Sustainable Economic Revitalisation.

On-the job trainings for youth

NGO Juventas from Montenegro and NGO Labyrint from Kosovo within the project *In Employment, Education, Training - IN EET* have continued with various capacity building activities in order to contribute to the employability and possibilities for the social inclusion of vulnerable population groups and for their access to the labour market. In that regard, on-job-trainings, internships, specialized and certified trainings

practices were enabled for the young people.

Specifically, 40 on-the job trainings have been provided for young people in Montenegro, out of which 28 are completed and 12 are ongoing. Accordingly, so far, 12 persons that complete



on-the-job training

remained employed. Moreover, the prequalification courses have been modified as per needs of target group and so far, 10 have been provided, while 10 will be organized for other groups of youth. Moreover, in prison, 18 occupational courses have been provided in Montenegro. In Kosovo, so far 22 on-the-job trainings sessions for youth are on-going and 18 more are planned, while 15 occupational courses are being provided to the prisoners. In addition, prequalification courses are planned to be also provided in Kosovo.

Tourism Outdoor Festivals in Montenegro and Kosovo

Within the project *Tourism for the Future*, partners NGO REA Prishtina, Mountaineering Association "Đeravica", Municipality of Kolašin and Institute for Entrepreneurship and Economic Development organized promotional events that aimed promotion and branding of the tourism sector in Kolašin and Peć. In particular, the tourism festivals were organized and eco trails in these two cities are created, which enabled the internationalization of the tourism offer, heritage and culture.



The Peja Tourism Outdoor Festival was organized in period from 24 to 26 May 2024 and aimed to serve as evidence of the collaborative efforts of public and private institutions in the advancement of the tourism and cultural heritage sectors in Peja. Through a wide range of activities and events, visitors had the opportunity to explore the area's natural beauty, adventure and cultural heritage. Activities included hiking, cycling, rock climbing, paragliding, caving and many more, including trips to Peja's cultural trails. Apart from adventure and heritage, the festival also offered rich cultural programs and conferences that addressed important issues such as the development of adventure tourism infrastructure and challenges in sustainable tourism management. The Kolašin Open Fest Tourism Festival was organized between 28 and 30 June 2024. The concept of this festival was designed to bring together and cross-cut the aspects of nature, adventure, culture and sustainable tourism. The project partners adhere to make this festival as a traditional event that will attract visitors from all over the world for many years. The goal of the festival was to build a branded tourist identity by providing joy and entertainment, tastes and adventures, promotion and networking of tourist potentials, opportunities and connections of Kolašin with about 30 different activities and events organized during the three days of the festival.



The initial activities envisaged an exciting panoramic jeep safari ride, followed by activities such as hiking, cycling, rock climbing, walking along the educational trail, with optional boat rides, via ferrata in Lipovo village, canyoning, tours, tasting of traditional food, educational corner for children, rafting, trail running, zip line, adventure park, art painting and many live music performances, etc.

IPA CBC Programme Montenegro - Albania promoted

As part of Europe Week 2024 on 3 May 2024, youth of the First Generation of the European Spring School, organized by the Municipality of Shkoder with the support of the European Union, had the opportunity to be informed about the achievements and possibilities of the IPA Programme CBC Montenegro - Albania.



The Antenna Project Officer in Shkodër, Nersada Mandija, presented the results of the IPA II projects, the possibilities in the new IPA III programme and what is expected from the implementation for young people from the programme area. At the end of the session, youth visited the Museum Room in the old town of Drisht, which was renovated with the support of the programme.

Project Steering Committee meeting held in Podgorica

On 25 June 2024, the Project Steering Committee meeting for the technical assistance project was held in Podgorica. During the meeting the final report of the previous technical assistance was approved and new PSC Rules of Procedures adopted. After this, the planning and timetable of next steps regarding 4th Call for Proposals for the Programme Montenegro - Albania were discussed, as well as the planning and timetable of 1st Call for Proposals for both programmes.



Capacity building activities for potential applicants within IPA III Montenegro - Kosovo

The Joint Technical Secretariat, in cooperation with the Ministry of European Affairs of Montenegro, Ministry of Finance of Montenegro - Directorate for Finance, Contracting and Implementation of EU Assistance Funds (CFCU) and Ministry of Local Government Administration of the Republic of Kosovo, organised a three-day training on Project cycle management for the potential applicants from the eligible Programme area of Montenegro and Kosovo.



In the period June-July 2024, as part of the preparatory activities before the publication of the 1st CfP within IPA III CBC Programme Montenegro-Kosovo, four trainings on drafting of project proposals in line with the EU rules were organized.



Namely, two Project Cycle Management trainings were dedicated only for local authorities and were held in Bar in period 11-13 June, while for local authorities from Kosovo was held in Peja in period 3-5 July. The other two trainings were dedicated to other potential applicants from Montenegro and Kosovo, i.e. one was organized in Berane in period 19-21 June 2024 and one in Istog in period 10-12 July 2024. The aim of the trainings was to develop and increase the capacities of the local authorities and other potential applicants from the eligible Programme

area of Montenegro and Kosovo for preparation of the project proposals. The capacity building activities were specifically designed to prepare the potential applicants for the upcoming CfP within the IPA III CBC Programme Montenegro – Kosovo 2021-2027 and were attended by 59 participants.

Partner Search Forum for the 1st CfP within IPA III Montenegro - Kosovo

The Partner Search Forum was organized as a part of preparation activity before the publication of the 1st CfP within IPA III Cross-Border Cooperation Programme Montenegro-Kosovo. The Forum was organized by the Joint Technical Secretariat of the CBC Programmes Montenegro - Albania and Montenegro - Kosovo, in cooperation with Managing Structures of the Programme, Ministry of European Affairs of Montenegro, Ministry of Local Government Administration of the Republic of Kosovo and Ministry of Finance of Montenegro – Directorate for Finance, Contracting and Implementation of EU Assistance Funds (CFCU). The Forum was organized in Peja on 26th July 2024, with the aim to provide detailed information to the participants about the IPA III Cross-border Cooperation Programme Montenegro – Kosovo 2021-2027 and to enable potential project partners from both sides of the programme area to meet each other, to share and discuss their project ideas and to establish personal contacts for future partnership formation and successful project cooperation.



During the first session of the event, participants were informed about the IPA III Cross-border Cooperation Programme Montenegro – Kosovo 2021-2027, the principles of cross-border partnership and the overall content of the Application Package. Moreover, during the second session, participants took part in thematic workshops of particular interest to them, where they learned more on programme's thematic priorities, shared project ideas, identified possible partners, exchanged contact details and created a foundation for future possible partnership with potential applicants from the other side of the border.
